About Marc

Marc FriedenberG first moved to State College fifteen years ago to enroll at Penn State's College of Information Sciences and Technology, where he graduated in 2006 with a Master's thesis. After studying cyber law and Internet privacy at Columbia law school, he worked for two law firms and pursued cases against the Wall Street banks that caused the recession. Using his skill with computer technology to sift through the data and prove that fraud had occurred. Marc saw firsthand the greed, corruption, and carelessness that has taken over our economy and our government, and has never forgotten those experiences while talking to working people out on the campaign trail.

In 2012, Marc was recruited for a teaching position at his alma mater, Penn State's College of Information Sciences and Technology, and returned to State College, excited by the opportunity to give back to the community as an educator. Today, he serves on the Faculty Senate and teaches classes related to cyber law and the global economy.
